

# Acceptable Use Policy for Technology

Our Charter of Good Digital Technology Behaviour at Aspen Heights British School.

All daily usage of the computer network, including the Internet and Email activity, is subject to monitoring by the school.

When I use digital technologies, I agree to be a safe, responsible, and ethical user at all times, by:

- Accessing only my own account and not attempting to access others' accounts.
- Interacting respectfully with others online and in the Aspen Heights British School community, refraining from engaging in online bullying or disrespectful behavior.
- Seeking appropriate permissions and acknowledging the use of others' work when creating content.
- Not capturing or sharing pictures, videos, recordings, or any content of anyone in the Aspen Heights British School community without explicit teacher instruction.
- Respecting copyright and intellectual property laws when conducting research and presenting my work.
- Reporting any inappropriate use of digital technology, including their own devices, by other students to a teacher.
- Safeguarding my privacy and promptly informing a teacher if I encounter requests for personal information or feel uncomfortable or unsafe online.
- Respecting the privacy of others by refraining from sharing their personal information without their consent.
- Immediately notifying a teacher if I suspect unauthorised access to my account.
- Informing a teacher if I receive online contact from someone I do not know.
- Avoiding interference with network systems and security, tampering with another user's data, or attempting to access the network using another student's credentials.
- Adhering to guidelines on downloading and using programs, seeking teacher permission when necessary.
- Refraining from publishing or uploading any information about Aspen Heights British School or anyone in the Aspen Heights British School community.
- Avoiding access to inappropriate material or engaging in unauthorised activities such as gaming or social media during school hours.
- Using email solely for educational purposes as instructed by teachers.
- Handling Aspen Heights British School's IT devices with care and promptly notifying a teacher if any damage or issues arise.



# Policy:

#### Purpose:

To ensure all students at Aspen Heights British School use technology ethically, responsibly, and safely to enhance learning while protecting themselves and others.

# Scope:

This policy applies to all Aspen Heights students, covering the responsible usage of school-owned and personal devices.

### **Basic Safety:**

- Students may only use iPads, Chromebooks, or internet browsers during lessons—and only for educational purposes.
- A child must ask for permission before using any device during classes and social times.
  Social networking sites, personal email accounts, and video calling services are strictly off-limits during the school day.
- In line with UAE Federal Decree-Law No. 5/2012, Art. 21 (now superseded by No. 34/2021, Art. 44), it is illegal to invade others' privacy using digital technology—this includes taking photos, videos, or audio recordings without consent.
- All recordings made during school hours must be approved by a teacher beforehand.
  Our server actively blocks access to restricted or inappropriate websites.
- Any attempt to bypass these restrictions will be logged, and the incident reported directly to the IT department and school leadership.
- Students are strictly prohibited from using or carrying mobile phones anywhere on campus, under any circumstances.
- Smartwatches with their own internet connectivity are not permitted.
- Students are forbidden from accessing material that is profane, obscene, or promotes illegal behaviour, violence, or discrimination.
- If inappropriate material is accessed—even accidentally—students must report it immediately to a teacher or staff member.
- The use of Virtual Private Networks (VPNs) is strictly banned to prevent circumvention of content filters and maintain safe, controlled internet access.
- Students must not make deliberate attempts to disrupt the computer system or destroy data.
- Students may not alter school hardware in any way.

# **Emails:**

- Every student is provided with an Aspen Heights email account. This must be used exclusively for communication within Aspen Heights.
- Personal email accounts (e.g., Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo!) must **never** be used to contact Aspen Heights staff.
- Students should not use their school email for personal matters—e.g., signing up for outside platforms or chatting with friends.
- Y1 and Y2 generic emails



- Access to personal email or any messaging platform is not allowed during the school day.
- All emails sent from school accounts must be polite, respectful, and considerate of differing views—no inappropriate or aggressive language.
- If you receive an email sent in error, notify the sender immediately and inform a teacher if needed.
- Any email containing violent, dangerous, racist, discriminatory, defamatory, or inappropriate content must be reported to a staff member immediately.

### **Policy Breach:**

- Any breach of this policy will result in appropriate disciplinary action as per the ADEK breaches.
- Consequences following the Relationship Policy may be invoked by the teacher within the classroom. The use of devices at school is a privilege that can be revoked.
- Inappropriate use of devices can result in limits to or loss of use of the devices at school.

# To ensure technology and digital learning is safe, appropriate and purposeful, the following will be completed:

### **Annual Digital Audit & Governance**

- Conduct a full digital audit at the beginning of each academic year to assess current practices and infrastructure.
- Form a Digital Governance Team, comprising senior leadership, IT staff, teachers, and student/parent representatives, to drive digital strategy.
- Develop and review annually a whole-school digital strategy emphasising purposeful, safe, and balanced technology use.

### **Staff Professional Development**

- Provide ongoing, role-specific professional development for staff—covering digital pedagogy, cybersecurity basics, cloud and MDM tools.
- Identify and empower departmental digital champions to support and mentor peers.

# **Technical Infrastructure & Security**

- Deploy and maintain Mobile Device Management (MDM) with student-level settings and updates.
- Enforce firewall restrictions and access controls tailored for student devices and content filtering.
- Regularly audit technical systems (devices, Wi-Fi, licenses, access logs) to ensure secure and efficient operation.

# Student Digital Habits & Wellbeing

 Host student workshops and assemblies focused on reflecting on digital habits, setting healthy screen-time goals, and raising awareness of online safety.



- Schedule regular "Unplugged" days, encouraging screen-free learning and balanced device use.
- Incorporate digital citizenship and cyber-safety education into the curriculum—covering privacy, cyberbullying, and critical thinking.

# **Parent & Community Engagement**

- Offer Tech Clinic sessions or drop-in opportunities for parents to build their confidence with school platforms and devices.
- Collect feedback through parent surveys or forums to understand their needs and experiences with school technology use.
