I have seen some amazing talk for writing learning happening and everyone has been working hard to complete their baseline assessments in reading, phonics, writing, science and maths. We carry out these assessments to gauge where your child is, in their learning. This has involved reviewing objectives that should have been consolidated last academic year, to assess their levels of confidence. Not only is this crucial in determining their next steps, it is also very important in identifying gaps in learning that may be critical building blocks to future progress. This information will inform differentiation for the year group objectives in the class, enabling learning to be personalised. I have also really enjoyed seeing all of the posts on Seesaw that our distance learners have been making. Well done to everybody who has joined their class live sessions and interacting with their teachers and peers. We are working extremely hard to support our distance learners further, so please look out for the weekly emails from your teacher every Thursday about this. You will also receive a family overview today of the learning that will be taking place this term.

Another highlight of the week was our 'family fun with numbers' live Facebook event - we clearly have some talented mathematicians at Aspen Heights!

Most of you know that I often report on our school attendance each week in the newsletter. I have looked at the attendance across EYFS, lower primary and upper primary for both onsite learners and distance learners. It is important for you to come to school every day, where possible, or interact with your teacher online each day so you do not miss any learning. Secondary Update

The transition to Key Stage 3 and to a new distance learning programme for many of our children is going well. Transition involves pupils adjusting to different procedures and to subjects being departmentalised with different teachers teaching them. Currently, our pupils are coping well with the transition.

We are following the 4C's of Aspen Heights: cooperation, consideration, common sense and courtesy. I am pleased to say that many children have received a 'Golden Ticket' this week for demonstrating our 4C's and for some amazing learning. Well done secondary children!

It is important that your child attends school every day to learn. Each live lesson helps to construct new subject knowledge and skills. Absence at this early stage will have an impact on your child's learning and their ability to feel like a valued member of their form class.

We are encouraging all children to become independent young people and as such please encourage them to prepare for their lessons the night before by having their laptops or chromebooks shut down and put on charge. They should also have their uniform laid out ready for the next morning so that they can have a good start to the day. All children should open their electronic devices by 7:50am so that they are logged on and ready for form time to start at 8am.



Casper FS2 Do - "My favourite part is playing with the cars and the dinosaurs."





Noura from Year 2 said her favourite part of the week was "seeing my friends again and making new ones".







using eggs and cola!"


Marwan from Year 5 Parrotfish: "I enjoyed writing my own kenning because it made me think about how to describe my animal and I got better at describing."


Everyone has had a great first week keeping safe and finding new and exciting ways to show their amazing learning!

Year 9


In Maths this week we completed our baseline assessment and then started our new topic learning all about 'Fractions and their application'.


We completed our baseline assessment this week in French. It was quite challenging but we are looking forward to making lots of progress this year.


A big welcome to the new academic year.
