

Year 1



We have had another great week in Year 1 and have been working very hard! In mathematics, we have been learning all about measuring. First, we compared the sizes of different objects, putting them in order from shortest to tallest/longest. Then, we measured things using nonstandard measurements, such as our hands and feet! Finally, we have been learning how to measure using cubes.

In English, we have continued our learning on Jack and the Beanstalk. We started the week by sequencing pictures of the story and writing sentences to match. Then, we innovated the class story map to create our own version and came up with some wonderful ideas. We have been practicing re-telling our own story with our friends. Some of us have been creative and made our own characters and beanstalks. You can see them on display in our classrooms.











In science, we have been looking at the differences between fruit and vegetables. We made a prediction about what we might find inside them and then opened them up to see if we were right. We noticed that some have seeds and some do not. We really enjoyed our investigation!

This week, we have also been looking forward to International Day. We learnt all about the country that we will be celebrating and have been talking about the similarities and differences that we have noticed. We have been lucky to explore some of the special things we might find there and have even had a go at creating the flag for our chosen country. We are very excited about celebrating further in the coming weeks! This week in mathematics, we have been learning all about measure. We have used a range of equipment to measure length, weight and even capacity which we have really enjoyed, we loved measuring each others heights! We then worked on comparing our measurements using the equals, greater than and less than signs.

In English this week, we have continued to learn the story 'On the Way Home' and we are now very good with our actions. We have had lots of fun innovating the story and creating our own versions. We changed lots of different parts of the story to make it our own like the characters, the lies which were told, the injury and the settings. We loved sharing our own stories with all our friends!















During science, we went to the hydroponics greenhouse to observe any changes to our seeds and recorded it in our plant diary. We were amazed to see how some of them have grown!

In topic, this week we have been learning about our selected country in preparation for 'International Day'. We have learnt about their flag, capital city, clothes, culture, food and dress. As a class we have decided which food we are going to make and we have made a shopping list of items we need to buy when we go on our trip to Carrefour.

We really enjoyed playing the maths games year 6 made as part of Maths Week last week, it was lovely to play with the older children and to show them our maths skills.

Year 3







It has been an exciting and busy week in Year 3. Our focus this week in assembly was knowing who helps us in our community. We thought about who we could help and how we could do so.

We have been doing our hot writes in English this week. Each of the children chose a place to write a postcard from. We were focusing on writing in the correct tense, using contractions and thinking of interesting synonyms to make our meaning clearer.

In mathematics, we have been learning all about fractions. We found the fractions of shapes and amounts using different resources. We learned that fractions are equal amounts of a whole and that some fractions are equivalent.









We had an amazing time on our trip to the Abu Dhabi Science Festival. It was so much fun learning about science by taking part in the different STEAM activities!

We're very excited for International Day after the half term break. Y3 Flamingos are learning about Oman, Y3 Kingfisher are looking at Brazil and Y3 Ostrich are finding out about the Netherlands. We look forward to all our families joining us on the day.

It's been an incredible week to end the half term in Year 4!

In English, we loved coming up with new characters for a description. Many of us used characters from other stories we had read but some of us created our own character. We are all slowly gaining confidence in using the boxing up method to plan a text. The vocabulary some children included to spark the readers imagination was fantastic.

In mathematics, we had a successful week in both classes. Miss Mahony's group were experts in finding the properties of shapes. We loved using angle eaters (or pacmans) to hunt for right angles around the classroom. We also enjoyed the practical work to identify lines of symmetry, using string made it easy to spot. Miss Radfords group quickly grasped finding the perimeter of rectangles and applied this knowledge to problem solving perimeter problems.



















In science, we completed an escape room challenge. It was so much fun but tricky at times to crack the code, as it tested all our knowledge on solids, liquids, gases and the water cycle. It was fantastic to see the artwork non native students produced; we were amazed by their progress when attempting to replicate Quentin Blake's style. This week was also our first trip to the hydroponics garden. Luckily, we got to do some planting and can't wait to see how it begins to grow after the holidays.

Year 5






This week in English, we have written our own traditional tales and have read them out in class. We have focused on how we, as writers, can create suspense and intrigue for the reader. After half term we will create e-books of our tales and share them with a younger class for everyone to enjoy!

In mathematics this week, we have enjoyed learning all about fractions. We have looked at numerators and denominators and have compared, ordered and simplified them. We used practical resources to help us see how big or small different fractions are. We completed an investigation and shared our findings with our friends.





In science, we tested our question 'What temperature will cause evaporation to happen faster?'. We used a range of places to store our solution and we also noticed that the places with higher temperatures meant that the liquid in the solution dissolved faster.





This week started with an incredible visit to The Grand Mosque. The children had a guided tour and found out some amazing facts, for example Allah has more than one name. They also visited the Mosque Library where they shared Arabic books.

In science, we put our hypotheses to the test! We wanted to find out the effect exercise has on our heart rate. The children planned their own investigation and ways of collecting and recording data and conducted their investigation. Ask your child what they found out and what their results showed!











Year 6





In mathematics, the children have been enjoying a range of mathematical concepts; calculating using Roman Numerals and solving real life problems with negative numbers.

In English, we have begun pulling together all our learning in this unit. We are starting to write our own suspense stories using the key text as a model. To support our planning and writing process, we broke the story down into a beginning, middle and an end. The children had lots of fun using words, phrases and techniques to build the suspense in their stories.

Oasis Class




This week we have been working a lot on fine motor activities for improving pencil grasp. We have been struggling a lot with pencil grip in the past. To help us with pencil grip, we started with some play dough activities, chalk writing while standing, coloured vegetables using crayons and then finally put into practise what we learnt by tracing numbers 0-10 during number formation. Pencil grip is a difficult task for us but our wonderful teachers and therapists assisted us a lot help to finish our task. We will continue doing more fine motor activities during sensory play and circle time to improve our pencil grip.















This week in Science we have started to study 'Electricity'. We have discovered the different effects of current when a circuit is made in series or parallel and we linked this to the brightness of the bulbs.

In Mathematics, we have discovered and used equivalency of fractions, decimals and percentages. Then we worked on finding the percentage of the given amount. We also started revising for the test on fractions, decimals and percentages. The test on those topics will be on the first week back after the half term.

In our French lesson, we completed our halfterm assessment. We were assessed on our learning so far this term. It is important that we reflect on our performance and review our assessment in the next lesson. We also revised our numbers and had fun with numbers in a group activity.

In Humanities, we have been studying floods and flooding and looking at the causes and consequences of this. We have now finished our work studying Weather and Climate and will move on to History after the half term break.

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
This week in Science we have looked at how the speed of light changes in different media and how this changed the behaviour of the light ray. We have linked this phenomenon of 'Refraction' to the real world by visiting the swimming pool and seeing how objects underwater appear closer than they actually are. We have also studied the eye and seen how refraction can be helpful to those of us who wear spectacles.

In Mathematics, we revised graphs. Students should now be able to interpret the conversion, distance - time and line graphs. They should also be able to construct those graphs and use them to solve real life problems (like money conversion, finding the speed).

Music



In music this week , we learned about the recorder. It is a woodwind musical instrument that was popular as early as the 14th century. It produces a soft, flute-like sound. Compared to other instruments, the recorder is relatively easy to play, making it a great first instrument for kids or novice musicians. They come in many different colors and sizes to fit you. Recorders are a good stepping stone to harder blowing instruments that are held vertically, such as oboe or clarinet.

The keyboard is an interesting instrument which students enjoy playing. Keyboard keys are also significantly lighter than piano keys, which may make them easier for a beginner, especially a student who hasn't yet built up the finger strength to be effective on a larger instrument.
