What a busy week we have had in FS1 this week.

We are still learning our new story 'Whatever Next!' and this week we drew some story maps to help to remember what happens in the story. Ask me to tell you the story at home.

In mathematics, we talked about the shape of the moon and we learnt about circles, semi circles and spheres. We practised drawing a circle and even went on a shape hunt to find some circles in the environment.















During Understanding of the World, we used the iPads to research an animal and find out some facts. Ask us what animal we researched and see if we can remember where they live and what they eat. Our number of the week was number 7, help us to spot this number when we are out and about.

In phonics, we have been using our musical instruments to make different sounds. We have practiced making loud sounds and making quiet sounds.

We have been so excited by our learning this week. We have been making printed pictures of turtles, using shapes to make turtle pictures has been really fun and lots of us have learnt about a new shape called a

hexagon. It has 6 sides.

Also, we have been learning to tell the story of The Tiny Seed. We have been getting really good at remembering where the seeds landed and whether they could grow there or not. We've been planting our own seeds and been putting them in different places to see if they will grow. Some have grown really well but some of them have not. Could we plant some seeds at home and see if they grow?

This week in Year 1 has been very exciting as we have started to take some of our learning outside and use the beautiful environment and resources we have outside our classrooms. The children have really enjoyed this and we have seen some amazing writing, mathematics and art happening out there.













In our English lessons, we have been continuing with our work about crazy creatures. We have asked questions about our chosen animal and then researched the answers using chrome books.

During mathematics, we have been getting better at addition by adding numbers mentally and also solving problems. As usual we have had a very busy week of learning so have a lovely break off!



In English this week, we have continued working on different sentence types, identifying questions, exclamation sentences, statements and commands. We are getting very good at writing a range of sentence types now. We have also looked at the book 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Gravett. Then we looked at some more postcards and compared them by identifying similarities and differences between them.

In our mathematics sessions this week, we have been learning how to add. We have used different resources to help us such as dienes, numicon, counting objects and number lines. We have answered reasoning problems involving addition and written our own word problems for our friends to solve.

















In science this week, we have been thinking about the statement 'The older you are, the taller you are.' We decided to do an investigation to see whether this statement was true or false. We measured some children from different year groups and we were very surprised by the results as almost everybody in our class predicted that it was a true statement!




Year 3 had a great week of learning this week! In English we innovated our story 'The Wolves in the Walls' and created some very exciting story maps. Next, we began writing our innovated pieces, focusing on the characters, setting and the build up for our narrative stories.

In mathematics, we continued our focus on addition and subtraction calculations. Ms. Marrinan's group focused on the partitioning method to solve calculations, Ms. Ryan's group tackled some challenging word problems and Mr. Whelan's group solved two-step problems involving double exchanges in subtraction.

We have been exploring sound in many different ways this week. Using our voices to learn the Lion King songs for drama workshop week and all about how sound travels in Science by making a string telephone. We had a lot of fun experimenting with sending our voices through it.





This week in English, we have explored our new text about Abu Dhabi! We have focused on persuasive writing and thought about how we can use the features. We enjoyed using the app See-Saw to share our work and give peer feedback on how to improve.

In mathematics this week, we have learnt about capacity. We have used puzzles and reasoning skills to help us figure out capacity problems. We created our own problems and solved them with our friends.












In art, we created landscapes for the postcards we wrote and thought carefully about how postcards can persuade other people to visit somewhere. Both year 5 classes worked together to learn how to use new apps on the ipads in computing this week. We have been learning lots of songs for Drama Workshop Week and have loved getting to know the characters in the Lion King!



In English, we have started our new topic based around Persuasive Writing. We have focused on a persuasive speech and investigated what the persuasive elements are of the model text. Alongside this we have identified key events during a person's lifetime and used the app Morfo to bring this to life!

In mathematics, we have continued to explore strategies to use when multiplying as well as using various strategies to use when dividing. Some children became 'teachers' and showed other children how to deepen their learning further! We are enjoying practising our mental maths targets, and in particular have had great fun competing with our peers when using the app Math Duel.















In science, we have continued researching facts about light, particularly the process of how light travels to our eyes. We had lots of fun investigating which objects were transparent, translucent and opaque.

This week during structured play our occupational therapist brought in a therapy ball and peanut ball to help us improve our gross motor skills. The peanut ball activities were a bit tough for us but with her help we did ball activities in pairs.

For fine motor tasks we did some tearing and cutting.

Our teacher also taught us about seasons - summer, autum, winter and spring.





















In Mathematics, we revised probability and we completed assessment on this topic. We have also played and discussed probability games, inspired by experimental probability that we have studied last week. In our last lesson we have started talking about direct proportion and ratio.

In art this week, we looked at how to start building around the idea of modifying a portrait to suit the style of Tim Burton. In addition, we touched upon mood and how to create atmosphere for the overall feeling of an art piece and how to include our characteristics that identify us.

This week in Computing, we are creating a school blog with pictures and write ups of what we have been learning in different subjects. We have been creating different Paint 3D models and exploring different drawing and painting techniques in Paint 3D.

English this week has seen Blacky Beauty being sold and being forced to wear a bearing rein - new owners and a lot of change! We have started our group drama scripts that will be creatively collated and produced.

Our focus in our French lesson this week was household chores. We worked on analysing the vocabulary and creating clues/reminders for ourselves to help us learn the phrases off by heart. We had fun participating in a team mime activity in order to demonstrate each chore.

This week in Science we have set our own targets for the rest of the term before moving on to complete a full Scientific method about 'Melting Ice', where the children could choose their own question and variables to explore.

This week in Humanities we have been looking at the reasons William won the Battle of Hastings. We have been evaluating strengths of a leader as well as the tactical skills William had. We have used this to work on presentation skills and collaborative learning.







Art class this week was focused on how to incorporate our symbolic self into our self portraits. We reassessed what we completed and how to subtly use it in the design and completion of our final pieces.

In Mathematics, we have revised and completed assessment on decimals and ratio. Then we moved on to geometry. We have discussed and used the properties of 2D shapes, especially quadrilaterals. Then we discovered "angles in the parallel lines" and used alternate angles to solve problems.

The 'power of positive thoughts' has been the dominant theme in The Secret Garden. The cousins, Mary and Colin are good medicine for each other: Mary realises how less 'contrary' she has become and Colin is hopeful. We extended our word-level learning by using Thesauruses and they triangulating definitions. We were introduced to shades of meaning using the word 'chuckle'.

We tried to independently figure out the present tense of Faire using this previous knowledge. This will help us remember the verb in future.

This week in Science we have set our own targets for the rest of the term before moving on to complete a full Scientific method about 'Metal Reactivity', where the children could choose their own question and variables to explore.

In Humanities, we have continued our in depth study of China. We have looked at the Three Gorges Dam and evaluated whether this was a success. We have used this to try out the World Scholars Cup debating format and give the students an understanding of how this works.

We have applied our critical thinking skills through our Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA) unit. The unit has provided our students with the opportunity to engage in problem solving, teamwork and teambuilding activities, devising strategies to solve and figure out tasks set.

Swimming

This week we have continued lessons on essential self life saving skills in Key Stage 2 and 3 students whilst our Nursery, FS2 and Key Stage 1 students continue to work on building confidence and improving stroke technique.

Swim Team practice continues with some amazing progress being made in every training session. Years 2, 3 and 4 practice is during ECA on Mondays and Years 5,6,7 and 8 during ECA on a Tuesday.



Music





This week we continued our learning about the ukuele and got introduced to a boomwhacker.

Boomwhacker is a lightweight, hollow, color-coded, plastic tube, tuned to a musical pitch by length. Boomwhackers are used as musical instruments in the percussion family. The students took turns playing up the scale while we sang and then down the scale. It was a great visual for them to see that as the notes got higher, the Boomwhackers were shorter.

The ukulele is a member of the guitar family of instruments. It generally employs four nylon strings. A ukulele is one of those instruments that are quite unique in their nature. Originating in Hawaii, the ukulele has played and still plays a valuable role in the culture of this island. The most important aspect of teaching a student to play the ukulele is getting them interested in playing it. Students learn the basic chords, strumming patterns, keeping in mind some songs to learn, such as simple tunes which they perform in the Music class.
