

EYFS Update

With only a few weeks left of the school year, I am so impressed with the high level of language and discussions being had by the FS2 children. 'Tyrannosaurus Drip' is probably one of the trickier model texts for the children to remember and retell but the children enjoyed the challenge and recalled the story with ease. This week the children have been 'innovating' the story and thinking of their own characters and settings. This is one of my favourite parts of the 'Talk for Writing' cycle and I have



seen such a development in the children's imaginations. This will really help them when they move up to Year 1. In Maths, the children have been focusing on 3D shapes and they have taken part in lots of practical activities to help them remember the names, and some of the properties, of the shapes. The 3D shape hunt and making 3D shapes with straws were some of their favourite activities.

In Nursery the children started to draw their story maps for Rosie's Walk. This story has been very popular and even our quietest children have enjoyed retelling the story using masks or small world characters. The children have been learning about animals that live on a farm and this week they had the challenge of sorting the animals into animals that do/do not produce milk. It led to lots of discussions about the type of milk the children drink at home. This weekend would be a great opportunity to try different types of milk and discuss which one your child likes the best.

Secondary Update

This week has been very busy for everyone in secondary as our students have completed theirexaminations for English National Curriculum subjects. Our students have remained calm and focussed and I am very proud of their achievements. These exams have been used by our teachers to help inform the overall academic judgments for each student. We now begin the moderation process as a department to ensure consistency against UK standards.



Next week assessments continue with our international benchmark progress tests. There are three progress tests in the series which measure students' knowledge, understanding and application of the English National Curriculum core subjects:

English: focuses on students' technical English skills (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and reading comprehension, using age-appropriate fiction and information texts

Maths: assesses key aspect of maths appropriate to the age of the pupil including mental maths for those aged 8 and over

Science: measures two dimensions of science learning, understanding of science content, and working scientifically (application of skills)

All secondary onsite learners will complete one progress test per day as per the timetable below.



We have had a brilliant week in English.

Skills that have been developed over the year were put to test in our end of year assessments. Well done - all your consistent, hard work this year has paid off!



Seven chapters and a 1200 word course work study and we will have finished Year 9!




























Music

Exposure to music can also improve children's ability to learn. Music and movement instruction has been shown to improve children's memory, cognitive development, learning skills and expressive ability. It helps the body and the mind work together. Exposing children to music during early development helps them learn the sounds and meanings of words. Dancing to music helps children build motor skills while allowing them to practice self-expression.
