Dear families,

Thank you once again for your assistance and cooperation with a very smooth transition to distance learning this week. Whilst we are naturally disappointed we are not all in school face-to-face, we are proud of the provision we have evolved since the pandemic began. As a community we are adaptable, responsive and supportive- thank you all.









A few weeks ago I mentioned in a newsletter that, following Adek guidance, we would not be able to give permission for families to shift to distance learning towards the end of the school year in order to travel earlier. We have sought clarification on this, and we have confirmation that we are permitted to be more flexible in this matter. We recognise that many of us are living away from our home countries, and have not seen our families for some time, so we have decided to permit a shift to distance learning if families request for the remainder of the academic year. It is not possible to come in and out of school in an ad-hoc manner. We hope that this will enable families who are planning to travel greater flexibility and confidence that their summer plans can go ahead. 




#### Art and D&T:





#### Mathematics:

This week year 7 and 8 set up their accounts on Prodigy (https://www.prodigygame.com/main-en/) and started playing their game.

Prodigy is a platform that engages students as they explore the Prodigy Math Game world, where they answer appropriate maths questions to complete epic quests and earn in-game rewards. Year 9 carried on with their work on Sparx. Students now can use the Independent Learning section, which is great for consolidation of everything that they have learnt this year.









#### English:

In Year 8 English this week we started a new topic "Piracy and Film Theft". Pupils were immediately drawn into the 'robbers on the high seas' denotation. 














#### French:

#### 2. Solutions

- Air pollution is caused by the fuels that release carbon dioxide. To avoid air pollution, we should consider using renewable energy sources like solar panels/solar energy, wind energy, geothermal etc.
- To avoid overcrowding, we could build better infrastructure and the government can reduce the migration of people by improving irrigation facilities.
- Some possible solutions of reducing traffic are: optimising traffic light management, using CCTV cameras to monitor traffic, improving cycling infrastructure and improving bus services.
- a) Portland, Oregon 25% of workers travel by bike, carpool or public transport, which reduces the number of damaging vehicles on the roads. When it comes to waste, Portland reduces 2,434, 840 tonnes and recovers 1,235,924 tonnes of it. 33% of the city uses renewable energy sources.
  - b) Berlin, Germany After World War I, Germany has been self-sufficient and valued their green spaces a lot. With the rise of electric vehicles, Berlin installed more than 400 charging stations across the city. Residents also opt to share with one another in a bid to save the planet.
  - c) Stockholm, Sweden The city's aim is to remove the use of fossil fuels by the end of 2040. They do this by implementing new policies that encourage a greener society.
  - d) Amsterdam, Netherlands Amsterdam was one of the first cities to outline sustainability measures. More homeowners are installing solar panels on roofs and they even started to grow their own food.
  - e) Copenhagen, Denmark Copenhagen has reached number I on the list of the most eco-friendly cities in the world. The city is set to become the first CO<sub>2</sub>- neutral city by 2050. The popularity of cycling has increased since most hotels now provide guests with bicycles. 24% of the total food is organic produce.

#### **Humanities:**


Year 7 students investigated types of tourism. They discussed the positive and negative impacts of tourism. They investigated and explained four positive and four negative effects of tourism in Dubai. One group of students debated whether tourism is a threat to culture and heritage and supported their argument by giving two reasons. The other group explained why they think ecotourism is important, how ecotourism attracts tourists. They then concluded the lesson by deciding whether ecotourism was good or bad.


Year 8 students researched urban settlements and its types. They discussed how early settlers often looked for certain features in an area that made life easier. They discussed the problems that cities face today and suggested possible solutions for these problems. They also researched the 5 top cities in terms of sustainability.

Year 9 students discussed population and migration in Asia. They explained the population structure of a country and interpreted the population pyramid of a few countries in Asia. They explained the ageing and youthful populations of Japan and concluded that the population structure is becoming top-heavy and supported their conclusion by giving two main reasons for this. They compared the population pyramids of both Japan and the Philippines and discussed the problems caused by a youthful population. They concluded by investigating the 'One child policy in China' and its consequences.






















## Music
