
أسبوع ورشة عمل الدراما! الأسد الملك

- 2 x 2 hour well-being sessions per week


As your child continues to build their E-Learning portfolio on Google Classroom, I would encourage you to ensure your child submits all of their assignments and that their work is of an amazing standard.

All of the children had a great time re-creating the character to support them with writing expanded noun phrases and making puppets to support them in re-telling the text. In mathematics we have been really impressed with the children's level of independence when solving multiplication calculations as they have been showing us their working out. Throughout the week we have loved seeing your videos singing 'I love the mountains' and taking on the PE challenge wearing all of those layers. Keep up the great learning!





























We have had lots of fun learning across the week in Key Stage 2.

In Year 3, we had an exciting week baking, cooking and creating different recipes to link with Talk 4 Writing in English. It was wonderful to see so many children engaged with this lesson linking real life skills with writing. Your teachers would have loved to have tasted the delicious things that you all made! Well done to all the scientists in Year 3 who carried out an experiment observing the changing shadows of toys throughout the day and drawing a conclusion from the results. We explored new vocabulary in mathematics describing position and movement, an important skill needed for coding. We are all really proud of your hard work at home this week, keep it up!

In Year 4, this week we have immersed ourselves in learning limericks. Some of these limericks were entertaining and fun to explore. We particularly enjoyed finding our own Limericks to read and using them as inspiration when inventing some of our own. At the beginning of the week, we built a shop to help us make transactions as part of our learning on money. It was great seeing the children using their shops with their families. Building on this, we improved our knowledge of written calculations for solving money problems. But the best part of this week was trying to beat Mr Ram in how many layers of clothing we could wear at one time - we took some very amusing photos and videos wearing several layers of clothes!







In Year 5, we have produced some fantastic written pieces of work on Abu Dhabi... if you want your family to come and visit why not ask us to send you a piece? We have loved learning about space and some of you produced impressive presentations about space - we can't wait to see what you come up with next week. Our mathematics skills have been tested through using lots of different methods to find multiples, factors, squared numbers and cubed numbers...wow! We saw you all rise to the challenge and are really proud of the work you are sending to us, keep it up!


In Year 6, we completed our hot write linked to writing speeches. It was amazing to see how the students came up with their own ideas for their speeches and used all the features of persuasive language.

In reading, we completed the poem 'The Brook'. We loved reading your new name for the poem and how you identified the rhyming words. This week also gave you the opportunity to partake in a virtual library lesson listening to stories in Arabic and English.

In mathematics, you became 2D and 3D experts this week using mathematical vocabulary such as vertices, faces and edges when describing 3D shape.

Thanks for your positive feedback in science this week. We know how much you enjoyed investigating colours linked to our science topic on light.

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This week in Secondary, children have been consolidating their learning in Science for the States of Matter and Energy transfers topics.

In Mathematics, Year 7 drew angles accurately and constructed triangles. Year 8 was working with fractions and they "met" reciprocal. They learned how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions and mixed numbers.

In English, the children are coming to the end of their novels, Black Beauty in Year 7 and The Secret Garden in Year 8.

In French the Year 7's are practising their listening and comprehension skills through the clothes topic (Les vêtements) and Year 8 are learning all about ER verbs.


In DT, the children in Year 7 and Year 8 are starting on the journey to become Master Chefs!
